The IRS has announced that, effective January 31, 2020, applications for recognition of exemption submitted via the Form 1023 must be submitted electronically at www.pay.gov. The IRS will continue to accept paper versions of the Form 1023 for ninety days after the effective date of the change.

Organizations and advisors with draft Forms 1023 currently in process may want to consider finalizing and submitting those applications by mail during the transition period or the data may need to be transferred to the new version of the form and filed online. The stated goal of the transition to electronic filing is that it will improve the application process for filers and reduce processing time.

The Form 1023 user fee will remain at \$600 for 2020. This fee must be paid through www.pay.gov at the time of submission.
